As your manager/supervisor, I promise to:

- · Provide a safe workplace.
- · Give training on how to do the work safely.
- · Ensure equipment is safe, with all guards in place.
- · Inform you on what could harm you, and how to avoid it.
- · Offer clear direction on who to tell if you think something isn't safe.

YOUNG WORKER, PLEASE READ ALOUD THE FOLLOWING

As your employee, I promise to:

- · Work safely.
- · Follow safe work guidelines.
- · Use safety equipment.
- Use machinery or equipment properly.
